PREVENTION EDUCATION & OUTREACH EFFORTS IN 2010

MCVP Educators led:

- 340 Prevention Programs in 15 schools including:

- ❖ Bullyproof, an anti-bullying program for elementary students

- ❖ Sexual Harassment Awareness & Prevention Programs for middle & high schools

- ❖ Teen Relationship Violence Programs for high schools

- These programs reached 6,063 students, 292 teachers & 120 other school staff

- MCVP reached over 1,000 additional community members in various education/outreach efforts

Looking Ahead to 2011

- Paul Hebert will be assuming the duties of Board Chair in 2011. Amy Noyes has been Board Chair for the past four years and will remain on the Board in 2011 to complete her second term.
- Our 5th Annual Walk-a-Mile in Her Shoes (WAM) in collaboration with KSC is set for April 16th. The WAM Committee started meeting in September and has planned for the most successful walk yet! Mark your calendars and don't miss this amazing high-heel, fuzzy slipper, placard parade down Keene's Main Street – all to bring awareness to sexual violence.
- MCVP has formed an Advisory Council to help guide the fulfillment of our mission. The first meeting will be early in 2011.
- MCVP, with support from NH Women's Fund (WFNH) and numerous letters of support from other collaborative partners, has submitted a proposal to the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF)/Peaceful Pathways grant to form a Teen Dating Violence Council. If funded, MCVP would receive combined funding from RWJF/WFNH totaling \$100,000 per year for three years. Panjandrum Foundation wrote a letter of support for consideration of sustainability funding.
- In April, a second volunteer will reach her twenty year mark. Congratulations, Kim Scmidl-Gagne!

A Reflection on 2010

- MCVP will once again end the year fiscally IN THE BLACK.
- MCVP received an unsolicited \$10,000 general operations grant from the Henry & Patricia Nielsen fund of the New Hampshire Charitable Foundation.
- MCVP received a \$5,000 grant award from the Verizon Foundation for media literacy prevention programs and enhanced web-based accessibility and an additional \$1,000 from our local Verizon Wireless for our Holiday Family Program.
- MCVP rolled out the NH Attorney General's Lethality Assessment Program (LAP) in our region. LAP was piloted in Maryland and is a domestic violence response protocol involving police partnerships which has been proven to greatly reduce domestic violence –related homicides.
- Once again, Joe Warhall of Nitro Fitness raised \$4,350 for MCVP with his "Pumpkin Parkin" efforts. Thanks, Joe!
- MCVP gained 9 volunteers for our crisis line and in-office client services. MCVP's trained volunteers provided 5,317 hours which translates to a \$69,000+ value saved in our cost of providing services. An additional 228 hours were logged by other volunteers. This DOES NOT include our volunteer Board time for another \$10,000+ value!
